Hadith 1 Sincerity of Intention Narrated by Umar

What does it mean for actions to be 'by intentions'?

It means that the reward of an action is determined by whether you intended something for heavenly or worldly benefit. If you wanted wordly benefit then that is where your reward will lie, if you wanted Allah's pleasure then that is where your reward will lie.

This hadith therefore means, the reward of an action made by a person is given based on his intention. A person should therefore not do anything without correcting his reasons for doing so and thinking about the effect it has on his hereafter and the hereafter of others.
